Course Description

Secondary Mathematics 1 is set-up to help students expand and solidify concepts learned in previous years. One focus will be to deepen the understanding of linear functions by comparing and contrasting them with exponential functions. A second focus will be to extend the understanding of geometric figures by looking at the specific properties of the figures.

Required Materials

1. Pens or pencils for in class work. Pencils are preferred.
2. Optional – Scientific Calculator (TI-30x) or Graphing Calculator (TI-84)
 - Casio Calculators are not allowed
3. A 3-ring binder will be provided and kept in class.
 - A math Folder is suggested to transport practice that needs to be finished at home.

Grading Policies

Your grades will be based off of assignments (15%), Participation (5%), and assessments (80%). The grading scale will be as follows:

Assessments

If you have an excused absence on the day of the quiz or test, you will be given one week to make it up. After that you will receive a zero. Test and quiz retakes will be given on an individual basis. A student must have completed all practice to qualify for a retake.

Absent Work

Practice will be posted on the website and on Skyward. You are responsible to find out what practice you missed. All late/absent work is due before the unit test.
